

AN ORDINANCE TO RESTRICT CERTAIN RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES DURING THE WV STATE FOLK FESTIVAL

Whereas, the Common Council of the City of Glenville recognizes that during the WV State Folk Festival public safety is a critical issue, and

Whereas, it has been ascertained that certain recreational activities are adverse to the public's safety and welfare due to the increased volume of pedestrian traffic associated with said festival, and

Whereas, the Common Council deems it necessary to curtail these recreational activities in the interest of public safety.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, the following activities are prohibited on all streets, sidewalks or other properties owned by, or otherwise legally controlled by the City of Glenville which are utilized, in any manner, for Folk Festival purposes.

1. Riding bicycles
2. Riding skateboards
3. Riding scooters
4. Roller blading or skating (Including "in-line" skates)
5. Any other means of recreational transportation

That any individual found to be in violation of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of not less than twenty five (\$25.00) dollars nor more than one hundred (\$100.00) dollars, and confiscation of his/her equipment to be returned at the conclusion of said Festival, and

That the Common Council declares this an emergency ordinance and therefore will take effect upon passage of it's initial reading, and

That copies of this ordinance be placed, posted or otherwise conspicuously displayed before and during the Folk Festival.
